Introduction

- King Solomon's proverbs and they are from his own observations
- General Truths that are given to govern life and conduct.
- Antithetical Parallelism (Poetry)
- Many proverbs show us a contrast between doing righteousness in wisdom and doing wickedness in foolishness.

Wisdom Vs Foolishness

- The first contrast is the contrast between wisdom and folly.
- A wise son makes a father glad, but a foolish son is the grief to his mother(v1)
 - -Solomon himself is wise son to King David and Mother Bathsheba
 - -When Esau was forty years old, he took as wives Judith the daughter of Beeri the Hittite, and Basemath the daughter of Elon the Hittite. ³⁵ And they were a grief of mind to Isaac and Rebekah(Genesis 26:34)
- The wise in heart will receive commands, But a prating fool will fall(v8)
- Wise people store up knowledge, But the mouth of the foolish is near destruction. (v14). Timothy is best example 1 Timothy 3:14-15

Righteousness versus Wickedness

- Treasures of wickedness profit nothing, but righteousness delivers from death (10:2)
 - Gehazi (1 Kings 5:16) and
 - Sermon on the Mount Richman Parable (Mat 7:24-27)
 - Noah (Righteous)
- Blessings are upon the head of the righteous man, but the mouth of the wicked conceals violence.
- The memory of the righteous man is blessed, but the name of the wicked will rot (v. 6-7).
- The mouth of the righteous man is a fountain of life, but the mouth of the wicked conceals violence (v. 11).
- The wages of the righteous man lead to life; the income of the wicked man, to sin (v. 16).

Righteous soul will not starve

The Lord will not allow the righteous soul to famish, But He casts away e desire of the wicked(v3)

-The **ravens brought him bread** and meat in the morning, and bread and meat in the evening; and he drank from the brook(1 Kings 17:6)

They brought honey, butter, sheep, and cheese that was made from cows' milk. They brought all that food for David and his people to eat. They said, "These people have become tired. They've become hungry and thirsty in the desert." (2 Samuel 17:29)

Memory of the righteous is blessed

The memory of the righteous is blessed, But the name of the wicked will rot(v7)

Remembering Jesus and Second coming

Righteous has an Everlasting foundation

When the whirlwind passes by, the wicked *is* no *more*, But the righteous *has* an everlasting foundation(v25)

Parable by Jesus Mathew 7:24-27

- ²⁴ "Anyone who listens to my teaching and follows it is wise, like a person who builds a house on solid rock.
- ²⁵ Though the rain comes in torrents and the floodwaters rise and the winds beat against that house, it won't collapse because it is built on bedrock.
- ²⁶ But anyone who hears my teaching and doesn't obey it <u>is foolish, like a</u> <u>person who builds a house on sand.</u>
- ²⁷ When the rains and floods come and the winds beat against that house, <u>it</u> will collapse with a mighty crash."

Righteous

- ✓ Delivered from death (v2)
- ✓ Have their needs met (v3)
- Have blessings on their head(v6)
- ✓ Their legacy blesses others(v7)
- ✓ Speak beneficial words(v11)
- ✓ Have wages that lead to life(v16)
- Have tongues of choice silver(v20)
- ✓ Say things that help people(v21)
- Are granted their desires(v24)
- Are established forever(v25)
- ✓ Fear the Lord(v27)
- Have joyful hopes(v28)
- ✓ Live forever(30)
- Speak works of wisdom(v31)
- Says things that are acceptable(32)

Wicked

- Gain treasures that do not profit(v2)
- Crave but don't receive what they crave(v3)
- Have mouths that conceal violence(v6)
- Leave a legacy that rots(v7)
- Mouth full of Violence(v11)
- Live in sin(v16)
- have small hearts(v20)
- die for lack of sense(v21)
- will receive the things they dread(v24)
- are easily swept away(v25)
- live short years(v27)
- don't get to see the things they hope will happen(v28)
- don't receive the life God has for them(v30)
- perverse things to say(v32)

Diligence versus Slothfulness

A slack hand causes poverty, but the hand of the diligent makes rich(v4)

He who gathers in summer is a prudent son, but he who sleeps at harvest time is a son who brings shame (v5).

Integrity versus Crookedness

He who walks in integrity walks securely, but he who perverts his ways will become known (v9).

Love Versus Hatred

- Hatred stirs up strife, but love covers all transgressions (v. 12).
- Not Exposing the Mistakes of our neighbours
- Must die within ourselves
- ...Love will cover a multitude of sins (1 Peter 4:8)

Restrained Lips versus Many Words

When there are many words transgression does not cease, but he who restrains his lips is wise (v. 19)

Summary & Conclusion

- Prominent words from this Chapters are Wisdom and Righteous.
- We must be persons of Right by following the Godly standards
- Right Person is one who loves Christ, persues after him and lives a life of denying himself.
- Crucifying the things (our self, our natural man, old man and our Character and whatever we have from Birth). Putting all those things on cross.
- Must know that we are Pilgrims and aware of the Eternal Destiny live a life accordingly.
